

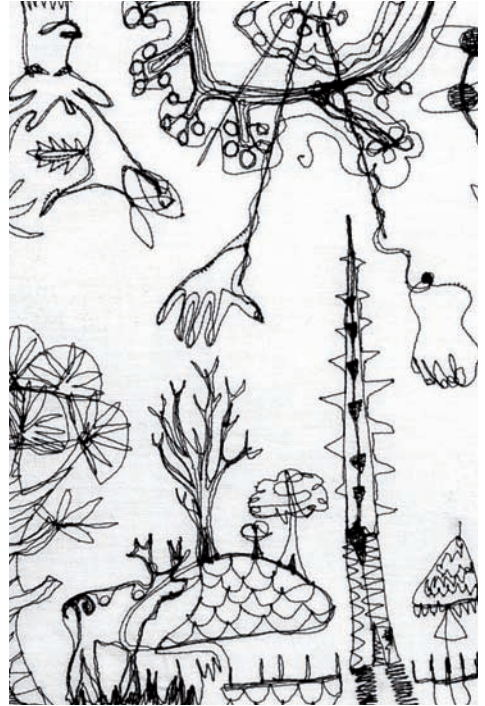

Nicky Thompson

Unearthed and Exposed

19 March – 7 May 2011

Nicky Thompson's beautiful yet haunting photographs of Elmfield House are the result of extensive research carried out at the Thelma Hulbert Gallery.

During 2010, photographic negatives taken by Nicky Thompson of the house and outbuilding were buried within the gallery grounds. The surfaces of these negatives, eroded by their time in the earth, resulted in photographs which form the basis of this exhibition exploring memories of Elmfield House. This is Nicky Thompson's first solo show following her MA which focused on experimental photography.

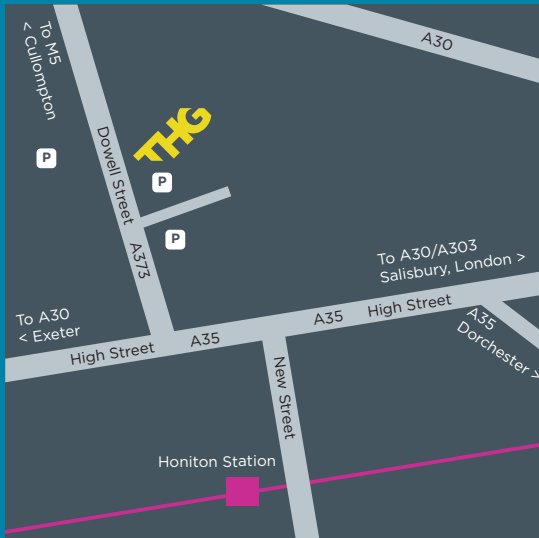

The Thelma Hulbert Gallery has changed! The Gallery now occupies the whole of Elmfield House, an attractive Grade II late Georgian town house, formerly home and studio of the artist Thelma Hulbert. East Devon District Council bought the house following the artist's death, opening the first floor as a public gallery in 1998.

Thanks to support from Arts Council England and EDDC, the Thelma Hulbert Gallery now boasts a stunning ground floor Gallery space (formerly Thelma's studio), a dedicated Learning Room, a Project Space and a Shop & Refreshments area, whilst retaining a room dedicated to the work of Thelma Hulbert.
