MAY

1. JOURNALS AND JOURNEYS

Thurs 17 May, 10am – 2pm Booking: Y Cost: £3 Where: Aylesbeare - Sidbury

Join writers Janis Lane & Phil Whitehead for a 7-mile writing ramble from Aylesbeare Common to Sidbury, guided by RSPB Warden Toby Taylor.

Exactly 25 years to the day since the creation of the East Devon Way, enjoy a fresh approach to the countryside and a different kind of workshop: Phil and Jan will help you express your personal and creative responses to the landscape in a writing journal. The day will end at the Red Lion Inn in Sidbury and we'll catch a bus back to the starting point. Age 14+.



2. INVESTIGATIVE DRAWING WORKSHOP

Where: THG and Fire Beacon Hill

Work with artist Angus Rutherford to explore ways of using inks and tools to create a collaborative panoramic drawing on the East Devon Way. We'll work both at Fire Beacon Hill and at THG.

The day will explore participants' unique personalities in their drawing and markmaking to create a large collective landscape artwork that will be exhibited at THG (as a photomontage). Participants will be able to keep their own artworks created. Age 14+.

3. LYME IN DARK GLASS

Work with artist Jenny Mellings to paint using natural pigments and try the 18th Century Claude Glass as a way of capturing the landscape. Participants will paint outside along the coast and in the museum. All ages and abilities welcome. Age 8 +.

4. CAPTURING THE SUN

Install your own 'solargraph' pinhole camera on Fire Beacon Hill with photographer Justin Quinnell where they will remain for 3 months. Meet again on 8 Sept at THG to scan your images! All ages welcome.

5. READ (TO) THE TREES

Where: Fire Beacon Hill

Get to know the local trees by reading aloud to them. Observe how they respond, and write or draw your findings. Artist Gabby Hoad will provide texts you can choose from, or you can bring your own. Forestry Commission Ranger Rob Greenhalgh will also be on hand to chat about East Devon's woodlands.

All ages welcome.



6. SHARING SPACE WITH NIGHTJARS

Using our artist-designed map, get creative together whilst exploring the woods, tunnels and old railway line. The maps can be bought from THG or East Devon AONB from August onwards for £2 each and will be available on the day at Harpford Woods. Our story guides will be on hand to direct you (or misguide you!). Allow approx. 2 hours to complete the circular route, so bring refreshments to keep you going. This is a rural route and guide suitable for the whole family.
